Keeping Your Cat Safe

First things first: If you have an outdoor cat, be sure that they have been spayed or neutered and are up-to-date with vaccinations. You may not be able to control who your cat meets on the street, but you can control any accidental pregnancies or altercations brought on by hormones. Letting your vet know that your pet is an outdoor cat will also help them administer the proper vaccines to protect against diseases passed on by wild and unvaccinated animals. You can also ward off flea and tick issues by administering monthly medications before your cat ventures out.

Outfitting your cat in reflective gear is another smart precaution. Reflective collars and tags will not only make your cat more visible to drivers, but will also alert people to the fact that your kitty is not a stray.

Dressing her in a knit sweater may actually do more harm than good, considering some fabrics may catch on branches and fences. To keep her warm and safe in the colder months, provide an outdoor cat shelter or structure in your yard. It will give her the space she wants, but will keep her protected from the elements. It's also a good idea to give your cat ample places to hide and relax without her having to go too far. Keeping a light on outside can also prevent wild animals from wandering in—and help your cat easily locate her home. Making your own outdoor property as safe and inviting as possible, will encourage your cat not to stray and keep her farther away from nighttime hazards.




